District Convention--"We're Off and Winning Together"

Our own Governor C.D. Reese opened the convention with a resounding ring of the bell and Bo Shafer offered the Keynote Address with his usual mixture of sincerity and "down home" humor--a the perfect start to a winning convention . Friday night was also the first clue that Division 5 clubs would be the recipients of many awards. *See page 2 for a full listing.*

Saturday morning's general session featured messages from the US Department of Education and our Sponsored Youth leaders. It was followed by workshops covering topics ranging from Fundraising to Marketing to Youth Services. Next up was the Foundation luncheon, where we were all apprised of the good work our foundations do in the area of scholarships and assistance in times of natural disasters. The afternoon featured free time during which many chose to tour Churchill Downs.

Saturday night's banquet spotlighted Gov. C.D.'s team, all in formal attire, and featured a gourmet meal followed by entertainment from the very talented Wolf Brothers. They presented a history lesson of America's wars through music, with an encore of an anthology of early rock 'n roll. Many of us purchased their CD's.

Breakfast Sunday morning was followed by a very moving Memorial Service , featuring the Down by the Wayside Choir and the Roll Call. *See page 2 for a listing of the Division 5 Roll Call.* The House of Delegates convened after the service. Two "housekeeping" amendments and an increase in the new member fee to \$20.00 unanimously passed. Mark Garmon was elected Governor, Al Porell of the Tellico Village club was elected Governor-Elect, and the new Lt. Governors were presented and installed. The strains of "Auld Lang Syne" came all too soon, but not until after many had already noted the dates for next year's convention in Chattanooga, August 17-19, 2006.

Recognition DCM

During the last DCM of the year, hosted by Maryville, Lt. Gov. Jan presented a slide show of the year in review and thanked her team for a job very well done. She then presented each of the presidents with a small Kiwanis token that epitomized their life beyond Kiwanis. In addition, \$100 was contributed in their honor to the KIF Hurricane Relief Fund.

Jan highlighted several service opportunities available through International and named Maryville as "Club of the Quarter". Clubs shared some of their upcoming projects. (Pancake time is at hand!) The banner was passed, and new Lt. Gov. Bob Ergenbright offered some closing remarks and introduced the incoming presidents who were present. It sounds like the Division is in for another great year!
